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# Terms & Conditions

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THE ERASMUS+ KA171 SMS IN (INCOMING STUDENT MOBILITY FOR STUDIES PURPOSES) PROGRAMME OFFERS STUDENTS FROM NON-ASSOCIATED THIRD COUNTRIES PARTNER UNIVERSITIES THE POSSIBILITY TO CARRY OUT A STUDY STAY AT A EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY DURING THE FIRST OR SECOND SEMESTER OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR [2024-2025](#).

## Beneficiary students:

Exempted from tuition fees  
Able to use University facilities without additional costs (excluding services with fees that are also applicable to host university students). In case funds are available for the country where the home university is located, students will receive an Erasmus+ funded grant for travel and maintenance expenses.

## University of origin:

Must recognise the totality of the study activities approved in the Learning Agreement and satisfactorily completed at the host university



## 2. GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS

01

2024

Be enrolled in Bachelor, Master or Doctorate studies in the University of Sousse as one of the partner universities of the European partners within the framework of the Erasmus+ KA171 programme, both at the time of application and during the stay.

02

2024

For undergraduate students: prove a B2 level or higher of English language proficiency. The level of English may be accredited by means of the taken exams IELTS, TOEFL and TOEIC.

03

2024

Exceptionally, Master's and PhD students (with research stay) may present a certificate of English and/or French (minimum level B1)



### 3. PRE-SELECTION AND NOMINATION OF STUDENTS BY THE PARTNER UNIVERSITY

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#### SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS:

As a general rule, selected students with a full grant will receive both the regular individual grant (IA) and the travel grant (II).

Students who meet the requirements for fewer opportunities will receive additional support in addition to the individual support for students with fewer opportunities (IB).

Students with a recognised disability of 33% may apply for additional financial support.



#### ZERO GRANT

Beneficiary students will be exempted from tuition fees and will be able to use host universities facilities without additional costs (excluding services whose fees are also applicable to host university students) but will NOT receive a grant financed by Erasmus+ funds, so they will have to cover travel and living expenses by their own means.

- **NOMINATION**

As many students as there are grants available for each country  
Nomination of students does not imply the granting of a scholarship, which will be subject to available funding and the final admission of the student by the USO.

It is recommended to establish a reserve list. ( see selection criteria)

1st PHASE Fall Semester  
(September-February)



2nd PHASE Spring Semester  
(February-June)



# 3.3 NOMINATION

## Documents required

The nomination is formalised by the student's home university.

Nomination Letter

Document of absence of the conflict of interest.

Research plan at the Host University and invitation letter for Master or PhD students applying for a research stay.

Certificate of foreign language (level B2 or higher)

Supporting documentation for the inclusion and diversity criteria (translation required if the language is different from English or French).

Documentary evidence of the publication of the call on the website of the partner university and the dissemination activities carried out.



# Obligations of admitted students: before, during, after the mobility

## Before the mobility

Manage the Learning Agreement, signed by the student, the academic coordinator of the USo and the academic coordinator of the receiving university and add it to the mobility file (Erasmus+ management platform).

Apply for a student visa in his/her country and assume the administrative costs.

Book the transport tickets and assume the administration costs. Students with a scholarship will receive the amount of the travel grant in the first payment, depending on the distance between the home university and the Host University, it is not a reimbursement of the total travel costs.

Bring enough money to cover the expenses in Host University during the first month of stay until having received the first payment.

Find and book his/her own accommodation

## During the mobility

Stay at the host university for at least 2 months (60 days) to be considered as Erasmus+ student and receive the grant.

Attend the face-to-face registration sessions (one general and one specific for the students of this call) and sign the Grant Agreement.

Sign the Amendment to the Grant Agreement.

Fill in the follow-up form halfway through the stay.

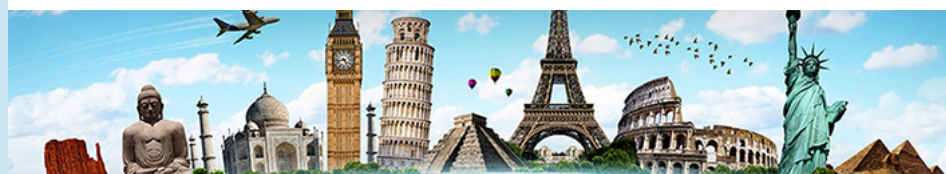
Attend classes or carry out the research work indicated in the Learning Agreement and take the exams that form part of the syllabus of the subjects they are taking at the Host University.

Inform the Internationalisation Office of the Host University and the home university in case of early departure (deducting days of stay not completed and if more than 60 days = return of scholarship). Complete and submit the Erasmus+ Participant Report (EU Survey) within 10 days after receipt of the link.

Come in person at the Internationalisation Office on the last day of his/her Erasmus+ stay or the following days to receive the Certificate of Stay.

## After the mobility

Issue the Recognition of credits taken or the research stay carried out at the student's home universit



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
